Then finally on Easter Day, together we will celebrate our conviction that love is stronger than hate, hope stronger than fear and life stronger than death.

Palm Sunday: March 24th

We gather in the garden behind the New Church for the Blessing of the Palms as we begin our journey through Holy Week. We process into the **New Church for our service at 11 am**. We remember the euphoria of the crowd as Jesus entered the holy city, a welcome which, all too soon, turned to hostility and rejection. We consider the part we play in this story.

We hear the words Jesus spoke in his dying and reflect on where such words connect with our own lives and the life of the world. A service with much silence and the chance to bring your own prayers to the foot of the cross.
